Forthcoming Events

Heritage Open Days: Guided Walks - 9 and 10 September 2023

Heritage Open Days is England's largest festival of history and culture, involving thousands of local volunteers and organisations. Every year in September it brings people together to celebrate their heritage, community and history. Stories are told, traditions explored, and histories brought to life. It's your chance to see hidden places and try out new experiences.

For some years now, two of our residents have lead Guided Walks of the Conservation Area. This year these Guided Walks will be on 9 and 10 September 2023.

Enhancing the Conservation Area

New Project "Stitch Your Story"

Create Studios are running a Stitch Your Story project and we wondered if anyone was interested in joining a team for our Conservation Area. We already have some interest. The project involves making large textiles banners, 2.5 metres by 1.5 metres that visually represent lots of different Swindon community stories. We'd like to include some of your Swindon memories and stories in this project. Don't worry if you don't have any previous experience with textile craft, they will teach you all you need to know!

You will work with Create's Lead Artist to create a large banner telling both individual and community stories. These stories will take the viewer from the past right through to the future. Each community banner will also have a film that runs alongside it to bring your stories to life.

They will run 3 sessions, all of which will be FREE - a half day taster in April, where they will bring the project to you. This session aims to get your ideas flowing and to introduce you to the different textiles techniques we'll be using in the project. There will also be two day sessions in July and by the end of these sessions we will have a beautiful finished banner filled with your stories.

There will then be a **BIG launch event on Friday 8th September.** They will gather all of the communities involved to celebrate all of the banners / stories so lovingly put together. They will continue to host different events in relation to the banners and are also developing a website to sit alongside the project so these stories can be shared worldwide.

If you know of anyone who would like to get involved then we could try and make up our own group of about 10 people. Otherwise we could join another group.
